

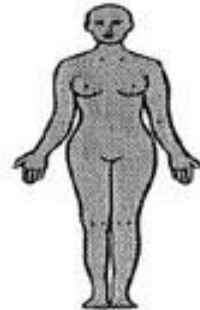
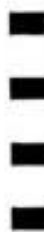

What is an FPPR?

FPPR (a fellow/diplomate of the *prescribing psychologist register*) is an indication that your doctor has received recognition as a specialist. He or she has undergone years of specific training in the areas of neurochemistry, neuroanatomy psychopharmacology, pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, as well as many other areas. On top of the normal 12 years of college education, your doctor has spent more than 300 classroom hours in training for this specialty and has undergone a specialized preceptorship serving at least 100 patients both as their therapist as well as the manager of their psychotropic medications. Finally, in order to maintain FPPR status, your doctor must maintain the knowledge through continuing education annually.



An **FPPR** is a doctor who is committed to an integrated, caring, and holistic approach to treating your psychological concerns!



What is Pharmacopsychology?

Pharmacopsychology is the scientific approach your doctor is ethically bound to take in the treatment of your concerns. He or she is committed to looking at an integrated approach including medications, therapy, behavioral change, social support, nursing care, hospitalization, and other remedies in addressing your particular problem. Furthermore, your doctor is committed to continually learning more about new treatments available for the difficulties you may bring to the office.
